Domestically, Starmer has said he will focus on economic growth, planning system reforms, infrastructure, energy, healthcare, education, childcare, and strengthening workers' rights, all of which were outlined in the [2024 election manifesto](#). He is also establishing the [Border Security Command](#) to replace the [Rwanda asylum plan](#). In foreign policy, Starmer [has supported Ukraine in its war against Russia](#) and [Israel in its war against Hamas](#), but has also [called for an immediate ceasefire](#) in the [Gaza Strip](#) since February 2024, after previously declining to call for one.

- h) I asked my mother if she could help me in emailing and or calling Enfield Council, so to get the problems addressed, as towards what was being done to me, by members of my neighbours,
- i) My mother and I both did contact the relevant authorities for help on a numerous number of different occasions.
- j) Many emails got sent to the official departments as has been filed documented and evidenced.
- k) I even called them by phone on top of sending emails as did my mother and recorded all the conversations with my dictator.
- l) The complaints that got sent by I and my loved ones got sent to the correct departments who would have any relevance in these situations and this got done by us with no correct follow up taking place of them sent correspondents thus so far, this is a serious concern to me: - "the victim" and any others their reckless behaviour may affect, indirectly or directly.
- m) Nothing was being done by the council.
- n) I told the police Doctors and the Enfield Council of what was being done to me illegally

- o) I got CCTV of what was going on but the police doctors and Enfield Council refused to act in accordance to the law and treat my evidence as it should have.
- p) In the few times that I did end up with an official person in my flat
- q) [REDACTED].

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- r) **A Subject access request got made**
 - s) To the Local council Enfield: --
 - t) A Subject access request got made to the Local council Enfield,
 - u) so chasing answers,
 - v) I re-submitted a subject access request into the local council again,
 - w) so that I could find out more information as to what was truly, being addressed by them and why and also what was being done about it.
 - x) In the request that I sent I asked for some of: -
 - y) Any information, as to any complaints made by my neighbours or any other person about me or my personal visiting guests, in any of the times, that they been and visited me, this was to get answers for the time period, of Enfield Council being my landlords; this was to include any anti-social complaints.
 - z) The reply that I received back, that was in acceptance off my Subject access request and was an answer of no there has been no complaints that got made to them, regarding myself or any of my other visiting guest, this got agreed for the time of the first eleven years, which I had lived in my home.
- 2+ Intimidating a young person that they stereotypically labelled as black person even when I was born in the United Kingdom with a black father and white mother. The government officials showed racial hatred on most intervals with myself and continue to discriminate me out of any United Kingdom Citizens.
- 3+ Due to my mother and her family being abused in a large range of unjustified actions that are mandatory to be respected by governance such as
- 4+ The corruption that I and my mother can prove that has taken place against my person illegally can get proved to go right to the top of the government's management tree of staff and this is an issue when rectifying the problems of cause.
- 5+ After so many different attempts to get justice throughout the standard channels of protocols to no evade of justice our family had no other option other than to contact our local MPs for protection that my mother and loved ones should never had to ask for to protect the life of her son Mr. Simon Cordell and the knock-on effect the corrupt and evil behaviour.
